



★ PROP 14 - STEM CELL \$

A YES vote would provide 5.5 billion dollars to fund stem cell research. A NO vote would oppose this funding.

★ PROP 15 - COMMERCIAL TAX

A YES vote would tax commercial/industrial properties (except commercial agriculture) based on their market value. A NO vote would keep the law the same and tax those properties based on their purchase price.

★ PROP 16 - AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

A YES vote would repeal the 1996 Prop 209 and grant the state government, local governments, public universities, and other political subdivisions and public entities (within the limits of federal law) the power to create affirmative action programs. A NO vote would uphold this ban.

SRE Social Ripple Effect

★ PROP 17 - VOTERS RIGHTS FOR PAROLEES

A YES vote would allow 40,000+ people currently on parole the right to vote. A vote NO would deny this.

★ PROP 18 - PRIMARY VOTING RIGHTS FOR 17-YEAR-OLDS

A YES vote would allow 17-year-olds turning 18 within the same year as the primary and general elections the right to participate in them. A NO vote would keep the voting age firmly at 18.

★ PROP 19 - PROPERTY TAX AND TRANSFERS

A YES vote would allow homeowners 55 or older or who are disabled to transfer their current tax assessment to a primary home anywhere in the state without paying higher taxes as long as the home costs the same or less. Victims of wildfires or other natural disasters could also apply the tax rules. The measure would also make big changes in property taxes on a home inherited from parents or grandparents. Under Prop.19, a child would have to live in the inherited home as their primary residence or they lose the big tax break. Proponents say this would generate millions in new property tax revenue, with the lion's share going into a new fund for fighting wildfires. The state will lose some and gain some tax money under Prop. 19 but voters will need to decide if they like where the money is going.

★ PROP 20 - FELONIES, PAROLES, AND DNA COLLECTION

A YES vote would add several crimes to the list of violent felonies for which early parole is restricted and also make those convicted subject to DNA testing for state and federal databases. Also, prosecutors could request a review of the parole board's final decision. A NO vote would oppose all these changes.

★ PROP 21 - RENT CONTROL

A vote YES would enact rent control for properties inhabited 15 years prior. A vote NO would oppose this.

★ PROP 22 - APP BASED DRIVERS

A YES vote would make app-based drivers (Uber, Lyft) independent contractors. A NO vote would keep drivers classified as employees.

★ PROP 23 - DIALYSIS CLINIC RE-VISITED

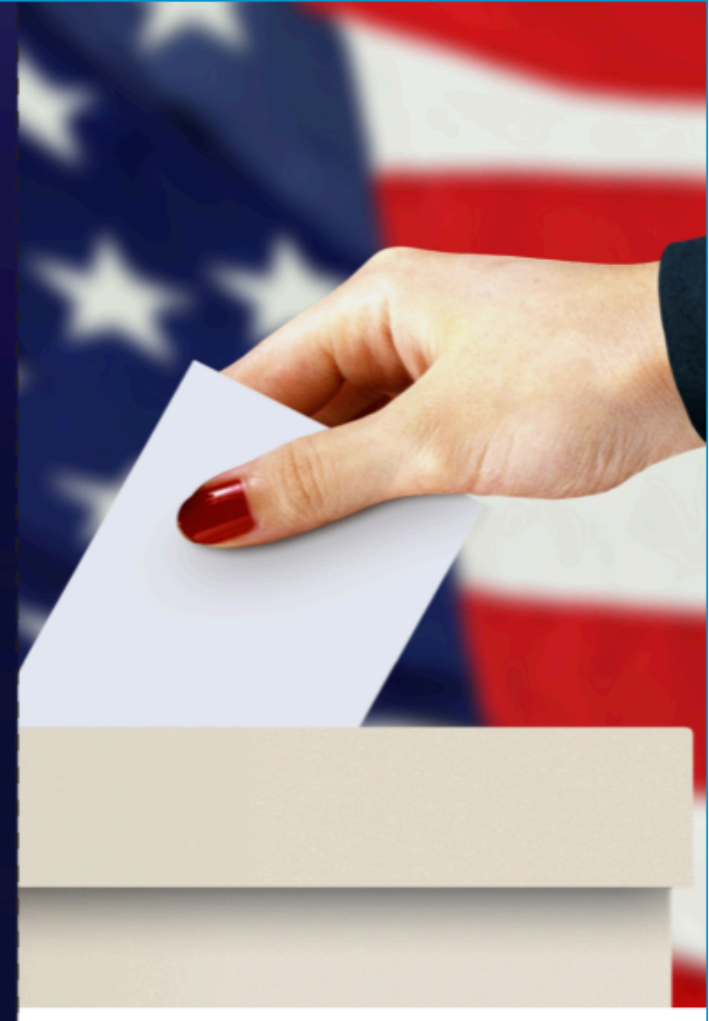
A YES vote would have an on-site physician, report data on dialysis-related infections, obtain consent from the state health department before closing; and not discriminate against patients based on the source of payment for care. A NO vote would keep practices the same as before.

★ PROP 24 - CONSUMER DATA PRIVACY

A YES vote would increase restrictions on company's collecting consumer data and enforce consumer privacy while also allowing consumers to opt-out of certain private information being used for marketing/ advertising research. A NO vote would keep the laws as they are now.

★ PROP 25 - ENDING CASH BAIL

A YES vote would end cash bail in exchange for a flight risk determination instead. A vote NO would keep the bail system the way it is.
